9. Data Protection and Insurance Administration

The Insurer, its associated companies and agents, re-insurers and your intermediary, may use information you supply for the purposes of insurance administration. It may be disclosed to regulatory bodies for the purposes of monitoring and/or enforcing the insurer's compliance with any regulatory rules/codes. Your information may also be used for offering renewal, research and statistical purposes and crime prevention. It may be transferred to any country, including countries outside the European Economic Area for any of these purposes and for systems administration. In assessing the claims made, the insurer or its agents may undertake checks against publicly available information (such as electoral roll, county court judgements, bankruptcy or repossessions). Information may also be shared with other insurers either directly or via those acting for the insurer (such as loss adjusters or investigators).

In the case of personal data, with limited exceptions, and on payment of the appropriate fee, you have the right to access and if necessary rectify information held about you.

Credit Searches and Accounting

In assessing your application, the insurer may search files made available to it by credit reference agencies who may keep a record of the search. The insurer may also pass to credit reference agencies information it holds about you and your payment record. Credit reference agencies share information with other organisations, enabling applications for financial products to be assessed or to assist the tracing of debtors or to prevent fraud.

The insurer may ask credit reference agencies to provide a credit scoring computation. Credit scoring uses a number of factors to work out risks involved in any application. A score is given to each factor and a total score obtained. Where the insurer uses automatic credit scoring computations, acceptance or rejection of your application will not depend only on the results of the credit scoring process.

Sensitive Data

In order to assess the terms of the insurance contract or administer claims that arise, the insurer may need to collect data that the Data Protection Act defines as sensitive (such as medical history or criminal convictions). By proceeding with this application you will signify your consent, and, where sensitive data relates to third parties, that you have been given the requisite consent to such information being processed by the insurer or its agents.

10. Declaration

We declare that to the best of our knowledge or belief the particulars and statements given in this application are true and complete and this application, declaration and information shall be the basis of the contract between ourselves and the Insurer.

We declare that we have informed the Insurer of all facts which are likely to influence the Insurer in the acceptance or assessment of our insurance.
